

Pupil Premium 2016 – 2017



Principles

Pupil Premium is allocated to schools based on the number of children who are currently known to be eligible for Free School Meals, whose parents serve in the Armed Forces and children who have been looked after in local authority care continuously for more than six months.

The purpose of the Pupil Premium is to help schools to provide targeted support for vulnerable children- not necessarily just children who qualify for FSM.

“It is for schools to decide how the Pupil Premium, allocated to schools, is spent, since they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made for the individual pupils within their responsibility.” (Source – DfE website)

The funding is therefore given to schools to spend as they think best, although there is a requirement to publish online how this money is spent.

Leadership and Management

The Head oversees the organisation of all additional provision, works closely with the senior leadership team, to track the progress of pupil premium children and evaluate the impact of all provision. This is also reported termly to governors.

Closing the Gap for Pupil Premium children continues to be a key focus of the School Improvement Plan, with actions identified and tracked across all subject areas by SLT.

In the 2016-2017 financial year schools will receive £1320 for each eligible primary-aged pupil.

Impact 2015-2016

Pupil Premium pupils perform in line with, or outperform, non- pupil premium pupils at Riverley. They also perform in line with, or outperform, against all pupils locally and nationally. (published data)

Progress of pupil premium pupils is at expected or exceeding rates across all key stages. (internal data)

Key Stage 2 results from 2016 show 76% Disadvantaged Pupils achieved expected outcomes in Reading, Writing and Maths (compared with other Riverley pupils 74% and national 53%).

Average point score in Reading was 104 for Disadvantaged Pupils and 103 for other Riverley pupils.

Average point score in Maths was 107 for Disadvantaged Pupils and 106 for other Riverley pupils.

Our pupil premium spend is evaluated throughout the year and adaptations are made in line with the needs of individual pupils. Case studies show exceptional progress for targeted pupils.
