

## Sports Premium 2015-2016



### Principles

This additional government funding is to provide opportunities to develop school sport, joint-funded by the Department for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport. It can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools. Last year £9805 was allocated to the school – as is allocated for 2015-2016.

### Evaluation 2014/2015:

Children at Riverley have had opportunities to excel in the sporting opportunities above in 2014/2105. In addition:

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The outcome of these interventions indicate that our pupils are becoming more involved and engaged in sporting activities and have become more skilled, as evidenced by high placing at inter-school events within the local community. Sporting achievement is celebrated through assemblies and whole school events. Regular newsletters report on sporting activities. Our highly successful sports days were well attended by parents and every child took part.
