

Sports Premium 2016-2017



Principles

This additional government funding is to provide opportunities to develop school sport, joint-funded by the Department for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport. It can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools. This year £8500 is allocated to the school.

How is the funding spent at Riverley?
